



Background

Previously, Pha Tang Royal Project
Development center was the unit under
Huay Lang Development Center. It started
supporting career development in the area
in October, 2004 by testing and promoting
temperate crop cultivation. In 2006, the
temperate crop and fruit cultivation was
promoted. In 2007, the Pha Tang Royal
Project Development center was officially
set up by the Royal Project Foundation in
order to work effectively, promote career
opportunities, enable local people to be
self-sufficient by improving their life quality
and conserve the environment.

Geography

The area is located on Doi Pha Mon which is the mountainous Thai – Loas border at 700 - 1,800 meters above sea level and covers more than 25,083 Rai or 9,917 acres.

Climate

The average temperature of the area is 22 °C (71.6 °F).

Population

There are more than 2,930 hill tribe people comprising Hmong, Haw and Mien residing in three villages and one community.

Pha Tang Royal Project Development Center

At present, field demonstration plots have been set up in the center to obtain the suitable crop varieties for local climate and environment. The center also supports local farmers to practice agriculture based on Food Safety Standards such as Good Agricultural Practices (GAP). Vegetable, fruit, flower, coffee and field crop cultivation as well as animal farming are promoted in order to create sustainable income and improve the farmers' livelihood. Furthermore, the center supports the community engagement in natural resource and environmental conservation, reforestation project known as "Three Forests, Four Benefits", soil and water conservation by Vetiver grass growing, life quality development, individual's and community's strength, Drugs-free Village Project, hygiene and environment development among hill tribes, hill tribe handicrafts preservation and Agricultural Credit Cooperative Group as well as Saving Group establishment. The center itself is also a learning center on highland agriculture for students, farmers and others who are interested.

Main produces of the Center

Mixed salad, peach, Fuyu persimmon, avocado, grape and Arabica coffee







How to travel

From Chiang Rai, take highways 1233, 1173 and 1153 (Chiang Rai – Wieng Chai – Phaya Meng Rai – Baan Ta) for 50 km. Next, Take highway 1020 (Baan Ta – Baan Tha Jareoun) for 45 km. After that, continue driving on highway 1155 (Baan Tha Jareoun – Wieng Kaen – Pang Hud) for 17 km. Finally, take Pang Hud – Doi Pha Tang highway for 15 km. The center is located on the right hand side 1 km. before Doi Pha Tang.
