



## **Background**

When His Majesty the Late King visited the villagers at Baan Mae Poon Luang in 1978, His Majesty learned that Red Lahu in the area, who were poor, made a living by tea leaf picking and opium poppy growing. During the walk along the mountain slope, His Majesty the Late King talked to the villagers and the village elderlies. "Wherever you live, please do good deeds. Stop growing opium poppy and stop destroy the forest. I'll find you vegetable and fruit varieties as well as well-bred chicken for farming to enable you to have income as replacement to money earned by opium poppy cultivation." Mae Poon Luang Royal Project Development Center, thus, was set up by the Royal Project Foundation with its office located at Baa Mae Poon Luang Moo 8, Wiang Sub-district, Wiang Pa Pao District, Chiang Rai. In the collaboration with Mae Jo University, the development has changed approximately 1,000 Rai of land used for opium poppy cultivation to temperate fruit orchard, vegetable farm and animal farm. In 1983, the office of Mae Poon Luang Royal Project Development Center was moved to Baan Khun Jae moo 8, Mae Wan Sub-district, Prao District, Chiang Mai.

### Geography

The area is complex mountainous terrain at 1,000 - 1,400 meters above sea level with small valleys sloping down to Mae Ngad and Mae Nam Lao river basins.

#### Climate

The average temperature is 22 °C (71.6 °F).

#### **Population**

More than 3,953 Lisu, Lahu, Haw and Akha reside in 5 villages and 7 communities.
